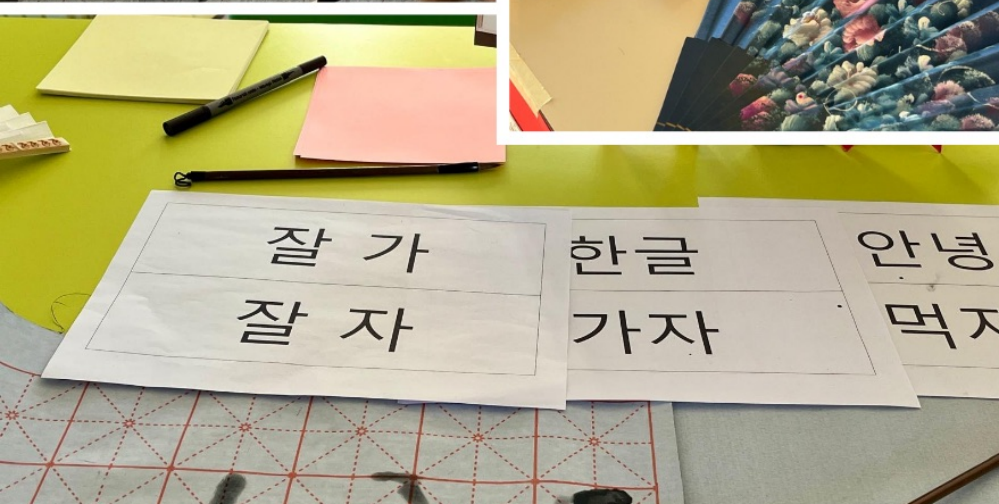

Scene: Scrooge's Office and Bedroom

Characters:

1. Narrator (Voice off stage)
2. Ebenezer Scrooge (played by a single actor, interacts with the spirits)
3. Ghost of Jacob Marley
4. Ghost of Christmas Past
5. Ghost of Christmas Present (not necessary to read if not available)
6. Ghost of Christmas Future

Props and Setting:

- A small desk with a ledger and quill to represent Scrooge's office
- A simple bed to transition to Scrooge's bedroom
- Lighting effects to signify ghostly appearances

Narrator (off-stage, solemnly)

(It was a cold, bleak Christmas Eve in London, and Ebenezer Scrooge sat in his dingy little office. A room of wretched, but cozy in spite. Scrooge cared only for money. His heart was colder than the winter wind.)

(Spotlight reveals Scrooge at his desk, counting coins, grumbling.)

Scrooge (muttering)

(But a humble Christmas is nothing but an excuse for silliness. Let them celebrate—I'll keep my job.)

Narrator

(But that night, as the world awakes prepared for joy, Scrooge would face the shadows of his past and imagine a better future.)

Ghostly voices (whispering)

Jacob Marley (ghostly)

Scrooge (startled, standing up)

(Who were those men?)

Jacob Marley

(It's I, Jacob Marley—your old partner in business. Do you remember me?)

Scrooge (terrified)

Marley? (Marley? I've never been dead for seven years?)

Jacob Marley (ghostly)
